Business Meeting

November 6, 2018

- I. Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p m.
- II. Prayer led by Larry Danna.
- III. Pledge led by Chief Woolley.
- IV. Roll call: Joe Cartwright
- V. Minutes from October meeting presented by Joe Cartwright. After a motion by Blake Thompson to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by James Bishop, the motion passed.
- VI. Financial Report: Chief Woolley:
 - A. No Surprises -- preparing for new truck in budget.
 - B. Checking is kept at less than \$20,000; deposits in excess are rolled over to CDARS account automatically.
 - C. Community Relations shows \$6,100 profit for last month.
 - D. Motion to accept Report made by James Bishop, seconded by Mickey Pallardy; motion passed.
 - E. Two more notations:
 - 1. E62 in for repair; expecting \$18K to \$20K bill; estimate is \$10K.
 - 2. County money in any day.
- VII. Communications: None reported.
- VIII. Unfinished business:
 - A. Membership -- James Bishop
 - 1. One applicant at first meeting tonight -- Miles Miller wants to be FF and help community
 - 2. One applicant eligible for probationary membership -- Sheldon Buchborn (3rd business meeting)
 - 3. Those not full members were excused for the discussion period.

- 4. It was noted that Sheldon Buchborn is very interested in joining the Army soon, and may not be available for PGVFD if he is accepted by the Army.
- 5. Sheldon was called back into the room and interviewed to bring more light on his plans for joining the Army.
- 6. Matt Cornell made a motion (seconded by Larry Perry) that Sheldon's application be tabled until February 1, 2019, in order to determine what might happen with his Army plans. Motion passed.
- B. Training: (Matt Cornell)
 - 1. 11/13 Truck orientation.
 - 2. 11/20 Family training; service days orientation.
 - 3. 11/27 Hydrant connection testing: hook up to hydrant, etc.
 - 4. Looking at setting up testing here in March for SFFFM FF1.
 - 5. Basic (old system) to FF1: need to do test to recertify.
 - 6. Chief Woolley also mentioned that the department would need to do HIPPA training in January, and Sexual Harassment Awareness.
 - 7. James Garcia noted that TEEX has a new online portal, which has all certifications from the past. Mickey Pallardy commented that there were still some bugs with the new TEEX portal.
 - 8. Billy Hoft started a discussion about learnings from a response to an apartment fire in Waterside. After the fire was contained and extinguished, several issues came to light:
 - a) Need for pre-planning;
 - b) Discussion on use of pre-planning form: does form still exist?
 - c) Several other issues at site.
 - d) Chief Woolley noted that preplans need to be updated.
 - e) Discussion of fire call and need for additional personnel.
 - 9. Larry Perry has certificates for those who took the HazMat Decontamination Class.

 - 4. Staffing: trying to expand volunteer program.
